The student will further participate in the 1L LCLD Scholars Summit from June 4-6, 2019 in Atlanta, GA. The student will support both Sheppard Mullin’s and Coty’s legal practices during his/her time with the organizations.

The application deadline is Friday, February 1 and we expect the interviews to take place in February. Our summer program will start in mid-May and conclude in late July.

3. What areas of practice are you most interested in and why?
