## Individual Mentoring Program

The Individual Mentoring Program (IMP) is a comprehensive initiative for first-year law students from diverse backgrounds based on the principles of legal excellence and personal involvement. Each student is matched with an LCLD Mentor attorney, who is a leader in the legal profession and takes an active, personal interest in the development of the Mentee law student. The goal of the IMP is to ensure that talented law school students receive the mentoring they need to maximize their potential, both during law school and afterward, as they prepare for the bar exam and launch their careers. **Registration is on a first come, first served basis, and will open in September/October, depending on your city.**
